Only persons who have completed the form and given it to a board member prior to the convening of the meeting or have made arrangements with the Library Director will be allowed to speak.

Once the meeting is called to order, the Board president will allow those persons who have requested to speak to the Board five minutes to present their questions, ideas or concerns. The Board president will call on each person to stand and address the board for no more than their allotted time.

You should not expect the Board to respond at this meeting to your questions, requests for information or requests for action. The Board will note your request and respond at a later appropriate time after board members have an opportunity to consider and deliberate about the request.
